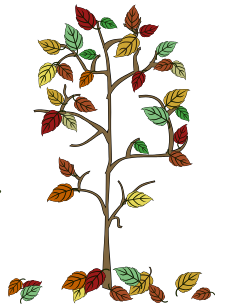

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THE SPIRIT OF GIVING

Fall is traditionally a time when we express thanks for the blessings we have received and a time to pause and make plans for the future. For many, it can also be a time for sharing with others through charitable gifts.

ENJOY TAX SAVINGS

As you consider your charitable gifts between now and the end of the year, remember that gifts made now can generate income tax deductions that could help reduce your tax bill for 2011.

With proposed changes in federal tax laws, giving this year may never save you more. The amount you save depends on tax rates and the portion of gifts you are allowed to deduct.

Remember that only gifts made by December 31 can help reduce the amount of taxes you will owe next April.

DECIDING WHAT TO GIVE

Cash. Charitable gifts are most often made in the form of cash, check and electronic transfers. When you itemize your tax deduction, gifts of cash may be used to eliminate federal income tax on up to half of your adjusted gross income (AGI). You may enjoy state income tax savings as well.

Securities. Giving securities (stocks, bonds or mutual funds) that are worth more than they cost can bring additional tax savings. Such gifts are generally deductible for income tax purposes at their full current value if they have been owned for longer than one year. They can be used to offset tax on up to 30% of your AGI. As an additional benefit, no tax is owed on capital gain that could be due in the event of a sale.

If you have investments that are now worth less than they cost, consider selling them and using cash proceeds to make a charitable gift. This creates a loss you may be able to deduct from other taxable income as well as a deduction for the

amount of the cash contribution. The combined deductions for the gift and the loss may total more than the current value of the investment.

Whether you make a gift in the form of cash or other property, any unused deductions may serve to reduce your taxes in as many as five future years.

OTHER WAYS TO GIVE

In addition to gifts of cash and securities, there are a number of other options you might wish to consider in today's environment.

Gifts from retirement plans. Retirement plan assets can be a practical source from which to make gifts. Many tax and financial advisors suggest using these funds to make charitable gifts because amounts withdrawn from retirement accounts can be taxable to you and eventually to your heirs, if left to them.

Giving in this way may result in little or no tax impact when you report the amount withdrawn along with an offsetting charitable deduction.

If you are over the age of 70½ years special provisions now scheduled to expire at the end of 2011 make it possible to make tax-free gifts directly from traditional or Roth IRAs. Such transfers can satisfy minimum required distributions.

A gift through your will or living trust. With changes in estate tax laws in recent years, many Americans find they will now be able to leave more to loved ones free of tax. This may also make it possible to give more for charitable purposes, both now or through your will or other long-range financial planning. You can include a charitable gift of a specific amount, a percentage of your estate, a certain property or all of a portion of what remains after first providing for loved ones.

Gifts of life insurance. If you own life insurance policies that are no longer needed for their original purpose, the value of such policies may be used to make a gift that can provide welcome income tax savings today and can also result in significant tax savings in the future.

Gifts that provide income for you or others. There are also a number of ways to give that can provide you with increased income, current and future tax

savings and other benefits. Check with your financial advisors for options that may be useful for you.

ACT TODAY

As you can see, you can make meaningful and cost-effective charitable gifts by carefully planning their timing and the property used to fund them.

Area of Need

Electronic Health Records

An Electronic Health Record (EHR) is an electronic version of a patient's medical history. EHRs are the next step in the continued progress of health care that can strengthen the relationship between patients and clinicians. The timeliness and availability of data will enable providers to make better decisions and provide better care.

The EHR can improve patient care by:

- Reducing the incidence of medical error by improving the accuracy and clarity of medical records.
- Making the health information available, reducing duplication of tests and reducing delays in treatment.

Wireless Campus

Comparing a traditional wired network to a wireless one is a little like comparing a pet rock to a puppy. One sits inert, waiting for you to do something with it, while the other trots right along with you, demanding constant attention.

Payoff of a wireless campus

- Cost savings – if you want to get the full benefit of Electronic Health Records, you must have constant access to it just like you would with a paper chart.
